MANATEES ON THE MOVE!

During Autumn, manatees leave their summer feeding grounds throughout the southeastern U.S. and head for warmer Florida waters, passing through Indian River County as water temperatures in northern habitats drop—typically starting in October and continuing through November.

Manatees cannot survive prolonged exposure to water below 68°F and will instinctively migrate in search of warmth via the Indian River Lagoon—a crucial travel corridor to reach warm-water winter refuges, such as natural springs and power plant discharge sites. These are typically located further south in Florida or on the state's west coast.

Round Island Park & Conservation Area is a perfect location to view these gentle creatures. In the fall and winter months, Manatees may be present in the creek and can be spotted swimming under the bridge or in front of the boat ramps.



REMINDERS

- •Yellowstone will be picking up palm fronds only. Any other tree branches, shrubclippings, weeds or other yard waste should be placed in your brown/orange bin or taken to the Convenience Center.
- •The timeframe to put palm fronds at curb is between Sunday at 8:30 AM –Tuesday at 8:30 AM
- Red reflectors (don't trim) or blue reflectors (no weed control) refers to your ENTIRE yard – not individual gardens, shrubs, bushes, trees, etc.
- It was announced at the 9/11/25 Board meeting, that Yellowstone under-budgeted by thousands of dollars and over-promised delivery in their contract.
- •Yellowstone's contract is automatically renewed on an annual basis and may be canceled by either party giving

- Second year 21,400 gpd

- Resident Bob Morelli submitted a proposal to beautify the unsightly section of 5th Street SW (northside) which is part of Serenoa's entrance.
- The Board appreciates his detailed work and is currently reviewing how to implement his recommendations.

CLUBHOUSE/POOL

- Please be reminded the pool is open for swimming from dawn to dusk only.
- •The pool fence surrounding has been power washed, and the branches protruding through the fence will be pruned.
